How CLUW Grew

In 1974, a group of union women came together to form CLUW, a non-partisan organization that became a powerful voice of unity for women within the labor movement and the workforce with four constant goals:

- ♦ Activism and leadership of women in unions and at all levels of the labor movement.
- ♦ Organizing women workers who are not organized.
- ♦ Political education and involvement of women in the legislative and political process.
- ♦ Promotion of fairness, equality of opportunity and upward mobility of women in the workplace.

With these goals as our cornerstone, **CLUW leads the way** on other issues that affect working women and families--- including women's health and wellness, child and elder care benefits, safe work environments, fair and equitable pay, fair trade, job security, national health care and expansion of family and medical leave.
